Alaska is a rare treasure. In one great place, you can see glaciers carve new valleys and break off into the ocean. Whales feed for their long migrations north and south. Wildflowers race to complete a life cycle within 100 days before frost returns to the tundra. Salmon struggle, spawn and become a source of nourishment for bears and eagles. The spectacular landscapes and natural wonders of the Kenai Peninsula, Denali National Park and Kenai Fjords National Park are the ideal backdrop for outdoor activities. We encourage you to join a hike, paddle a sea kayak or go rafting before enjoying a gourmet meal at one of our wilderness lodges—all without ever leaving the wilderness of authentic Alaska.


Denali National Park— Seeing majestic Denali (formerly known as Mount McKinley) and all of this National Park's incredible wildlife is an iconic Alaska experience. The only way into Denali is by bus along the 92-mile restricted-access park road. As a result, many travelers end up overnighting at the often-crowded park entrance and taking a bus tour that drives halfway into the park, then turns around. We offer the alternative to this—relaxed backcountry lodging deep within the park borders. Search for grizzly bears and other wildlife. Photograph spectacular landscapes, take guided hikes and enjoy naturalist programs in Kantishna.

Kenai National Wildlife Refuge— Parts of the Kenai ("keen-eye") National Wildlife Refuge were designated as wilderness to protect abundant moose populations, bald eagles and the prolific salmon runs of the Kenai Peninsula. The turquoise waters of the Kenai River serve as our path for exploring the refuge at the river's pace—by raft. And our own **Kenai Backcountry Lodge** is situated on a glacially-carved lake, deep within the refuge and accessible only by boat.

Kenai Fjords National Park— Massive tidewater glaciers spill into the plankton-rich waters of the Pacific, where seabirds, eagles, otters, whales and sea lions thrive. The rugged islands of the fjords are rookeries for millions of nesting migratory birds and the comical-looking puffins. Our newest venture, **Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge**—the only lodge located within the park borders—is tucked away in a protected lagoon across from Pedersen Glacier.

Chugach National Forest—The 5.9 million acre Chugach ("chew-gatch") is the second largest national forest in the U.S. The forest is prime habitat for salmon, bald eagles, moose, bears and Dall sheep. You can hike spectacular trails from our **Kenai Riverside Lodge** in Cooper Landing.

In the very early years of Alaska Wildland Adventures, we found the perfect campsite on the beautiful shores of the Kenai River...we loved the place not only for its prime location on the river but for its crucial geographic position as a gateway to unlocking the wonders of all the Kenai's wilderness.

Over time, the place grew into Kenai Riverside Lodge. And, our favorite riverside campsite is still there—enshrined as the riverside deck, where guests can enjoy today the very spot we fell in love with so many years ago. Easily accessible from Anchorage and near Cooper Landing, Kenai Riverside Lodge consists of our log lodge dining room and lounge surrounded by 16 cozy cabins. Built in the historic style of turn-of-the-century slab-wood mining buildings, each cabin has a private bathroom and is gently tucked into the forest setting.

It is the perfect place to begin or extend your exploration of the Kenai Peninsula. Activities include guided hiking on the trails of the Chugach National Forest and the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge; rafting the Kenai River amidst the backdrop of snow-clad peaks; wildlife viewing by trail or raft for moose, spawning salmon, bald eagles, a wide variety of other bird life and occasionally black and brown bears; and just relaxing in the beautiful riverside setting. Many guests come for the prime fishing for several species of salmon, rainbow trout and Dolly Varden. Alaska Wildland Adventures is one of the long-established guide companies on the river, and our experience counts when it comes to finding fish. Deep sea halibut fishing charters can be arranged, and the port town of Seward is less than an hour away. You can spend all your time fishing (see pages 6-7) or include it as a feature for one or two days of your stay. Many of our Alaska Adventures stay at **Kenai Riverside Lodge**, and a pre-night stay here is included on all **Kenai Backcountry Lodge** programs.

We also offer bay salmon and deep sea fishing trips from the port town of Seward.

At the end of the day, relax on the expansive deck at beautiful **Kenai Riverside Lodge** followed by a gourmet dinner. If you still have energy after a day of fishing, take a stroll through the lodge's grounds or play a game of horseshoes.

If you have travelers in your party who would enjoy an activity other than fishing, **Kenai Riverside Lodge** offers a variety of options including rafting the Kenai and hiking in Chugach National Forest. Your party can enjoy different activities by day and then come together in the evening to relax and share stories.

Kenai Backcountry Lodge



The Kenai Backcountry Lodge is located in the wilderness of Kenai National Wildlife Refuge and accessible only by boat — see maps on pages 2 and 3

Tucked in the forest against a mountain and along the far shore of a glacially-carved lake, this peaceful wilderness paradise is only accessible by boat. It's the most intimate of our lodges, and it is surrounded by two million acres of designated wilderness in the heart of the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge.

Originally built as a hunting lodge in the 1930s, Kenai Backcountry Lodge has been restored to retain its heritage with the careful addition of a few more log cabins and a few more modern comforts, meticulously designed to be in context with the wild character of the setting.

The only hunting we do now is with a camera, and dramatic lake and mountain scenery, eagles, moose and loons are favorite subjects. This property accommodates just 18 guests or fewer at a time to enhance the peaceful environment and pristine setting.

From the lodge, a mountain trail leads hikers through a variety of ecosystems to alpine tundra. When conditions allow, try guided kayaking in the evening to enjoy Alaska's lingering summer sunset. Relax around the campfire, enjoy a wood-fired sauna (with a quick dip in the lake, of course!) and seek out one of many wonderful settings to take in the moods of the forest and lake. At the end of the day, family style

meals are crafted with care and served by candlelight in the glowing warmth of the wood stove.

Extreme effort to reduce impact on the natural environment is central to the development and operation of the lodge. A simple but effective hydroelectric system provides power and reduces the need for fossil fuels.

As a remote, boat-in only lodge, we preface two nights at **Kenai Backcountry Lodge** with a stay at **Kenai Riverside Lodge**. Guests board rafts in the morning for a scenic float trip to the Backcountry Lodge, enjoying a picnic lunch along the way. We feature **Kenai Backcountry Lodge** in many of our Alaska Adventure itineraries.

Since 2009, Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge has been both an anchor destination in each of our Alaska Adventures as well as a stand-alone vacation experience for those seeking a more independent option. The lodge is situated on 10 acres of private land that is surrounded by the Alaska Native-owned 1,700 acre Pedersen Lagoon Wildlife Sanctuary. In a way, it's in a private park surrounded by a national park. And the Lodge location and surrounding landscape are simply stunning.

Great care was taken in the lodge design and construction to honor

and protect the pristine environment and for its ongoing operations to ensure a minimal footprint. We've partnered with local, national and global ecotourism alliances to continue to hone our best practices, and we are excited to share this exclusive property with a very small number of intrepid travelers each summer.

LODGES

Crafted with exacting adherence to ecolodge principles, the lodge has the look and feel that it has "always been there." Each log cabin is comfortably appointed with a private bath and a view of the lagoon and glacier scenery. As with all AWA locations, savor wilderness fine dining and soak in the rustic elegance of the main lodge, complete with wood stove and cozy lounge.

The journey to and from the lodge is a dynamic experience in itself aboard our private vessel that provides outstanding scenic and marine wildlife viewing. Whales, Stellar sea lions, horned and tufted puffins, sea otters, Dall's porpoises and a myriad of other birds are common. Hundreds of visitors experience the Park daily on the many tour boats that operate in the area, but on any given day, only a few intrepid travelers disembark to spend a comfortable night deep in Alaska's coastal wilderness at **Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge.**


At the lodge, wildlife viewing opportunities and activity choices abound. Glide a sea kayak amid glacial ice and harbor seals, join a group canoe paddle and watch for black bears along the shoreline. Learn about local wildlife and Alaska's dynamic geology on natural history explorations of the Pedersen Glacier moraine. Or, pour yourself into a rocking chair and take in the spectacular glacier views. Choose from two to four days or more! We recommend a minimum of three days to make the most of this pristine wilderness setting.

Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge is a perfect complement to our **Kenai Riverside Lodge** and **Kenai Backcountry Lodge** experiences. When you book two nights or more at any lodge, you can add one or both of the others at significant savings. See pages 14-15 for details.

Kenai Riverside Lodge

Access—Approximately a two hour road trip from Anchorage, **Kenai Riverside Lodge** is located in Cooper Landing, Alaska.

Activities—Rafting, fishing and hiking.

A true wilderness getaway nestled on the shores of a glacially-carved lake...the perfect complement to a **Kenai Riverside Lodge** stay.

Access—**Kenai Backcountry Lodge** is located approximately 17 river miles west of **Kenai Riverside Lodge** and only accessible by boat.

Activities—Rafting (en route to lodge), hiking, kayaking (weather dependent).

Accommodations—Private guest cabins feature at least two comfortable beds with private shower and bathroom, along with personal porch.



Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge

Round out your trip at the newest addition to our AWA family of lodges. **Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge** combines the wonders of Alaska's coast with amazing lodging in a protected wildlife sanctuary.

Access—A short 45-minute ground shuttle from **Kenai Riverside Lodge**, our boat to **Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge** departs the Seward harbor daily. A half-day marine wildlife and glacier cruise is our access to the lodge.

Activities—Marine wildlife and glacier viewing tours, kayaking, canoeing and light hiking.

Accommodations—Private guest cabins overlooking Pedersen Lagoon feature a minimum of two full beds, private shower/bathroom and private porch.

Lodge-to-Lodge Sample 1:

Two lodge combo: 5 days, 4 nights

Kenai Riverside and Kenai Backcountry Lodges

Day 1: Travel to Kenai Riverside Lodge

Begin with a scenic drive from Anchorage along Turnagain Arm and through the Chugach Mountains to **Kenai Riverside Lodge** (see page 4). Settle into your cozy cabin and relax on the expansive riverside deck before dinner.

Days 2 and 3: Kenai Backcountry Lodge

Watch for wildlife as you float the Kenai River into the remote wilderness of Kenai National Wildlife Refuge to **Kenai Backcountry Lodge**. Hike, explore and relax at this remote retreat (see page 8).

Day 4: Kenai Riverside Lodge

After breakfast, depart by boat and return to **Kenai Riverside Lodge** for an afternoon of hiking on nearby trails. Relax on the deck, take a sauna, sit around the campfire or partake in the lodge's recreational options.

Day 5: Travel to Anchorage

Morning departure to Anchorage for journey home or to continue with other Alaska travels.

Days 1 to 4

Same as sample itinerary on left.

Days 5 and 6: Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge

Transfer to Seward in time to board our private vessel, embarking on a marine wildlife search in Kenai Fjords National Park. Arrive at your home for two nights, **Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge** (see page 10). Choose from a variety of options, including guided kayaking, canoeing, natural history presentations and simply relaxing in and around the lodge.

Day 7: Travel to Anchorage

Kayak, canoe, hike, beachcomb or just sit in a rocking chair to enjoy the stunning views from the lodge. In the afternoon, return to Seward by boat, then board the Alaska Railroad to Anchorage.

Day 1

Your trip begins this morning in Anchorage. As we travel south along the scenic Turnagain Arm, we'll stop and explore a local trail system by foot. Hiking is a wonderful way to connect with wild Alaska and learn about local flora and fauna. Afterward, we'll settle into cozy private cabins at our **Kenai Riverside Lodge**, which is situated along the banks of the Kenai River and nestled among snow-capped peaks of the Chugach mountain range. Savor a well-earned dinner, and relax on the expansive riverside deck after dinner. Settle into your cozy cabin and relax on the expansive riverside deck before dinner.

Days 2 and 3

Watch for eagles, moose, a wide variety of birds and sometimes bears as you float the Kenai River into the remote wilderness of Kenai National Wildlife Refuge. Your home for two nights is the historic **Kenai Backcountry Lodge**, located on the far side of a glacially-carved lake. Choose from a full day hike up a mountain trail or relax near the beachfront. Take a sauna, enjoy an evening program or, when conditions allow, paddle off into the sunset.

Day 4

After breakfast, bid farewell to your wilderness setting and depart by motorized skiff across the lake. Return to **Kenai Riverside Lodge** for an afternoon of hiking on nearby trails in the Chugach National Forest. Relax on the deck, take a sauna, sit around the campfire or partake in the lodge's recreational options.

Days 5 and 6

Transfer to Seward in time to board our private vessel, embarking on a marine wildlife search in Kenai Fjords National Park. Keep a lookout for whales, sea lions, harbor seals, puffins and more! After witnessing the marvels of a tidewater glacier, arrive at your home for two nights, **Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge**. Choose from a variety of options, including guided kayaking, canoeing, hikes, natural history presentations and simply relaxing in and around the lodge.

Day 7

A morning outing allows another opportunity to kayak, canoe, hike, beachcomb or just sit in a rocking chair to enjoy the stunning views from the lodge. Return to Seward by boat, looking for wildlife along the way. Bid farewell to your guide as you board the Alaska Railroad to Anchorage, traversing the mountains and valleys of Chugach National Forest and Chugach State Park.

Take a scenic drive along Turnagain Arm to the mountain town of Girdwood. Board a helicopter and land on a glacier to take part in a classic Alaska sport, dog mushing. Drive or ride in the sled as you enjoy the dramatic scenery—it's like a taste of winter in summer! After learning about Iditarod racing, helicopter back to sea level and make your way to **Kenai Riverside Lodge**, your two-night destination.

Day 2

Saddle up for a day of horseback riding on an easy going, scenic trail ride through the beautiful Kenai River valley. Never ridden? No worries! This trail is gentle enough for riders of all abilities, and there's always the chance for viewing wildlife along the way.

Days 3 and 4

Float the Kenai River through the Kenai Canyon and across a glacier-carved lake to **Kenai Backcountry Lodge**, your wilderness haven for a two-night stay. Take an ambitious hike to explore alpine tundra and, in the evening, when conditions allow, paddle a kayak against the backdrop of everlasting twilight.

Day 5

Cross the lake by customized boat and embark on a special hike through pristine wilderness. Return to the comforts of **Kenai Riverside Lodge**.

Days 6 and 7

The adventures keep coming! Transfer to Seward and board our small ship bound for Kenai Fjords National Park, searching for whales, Dall's porpoises, puffins and other amazing bird life. Visit a tidewater glacier before arriving at our exclusive lodge destination: **Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge**. This seacoast paradise features kayaking, canoeing and glacier exploration as guided options for part or full day trips.

Day 8

A morning outing allows another opportunity to kayak, canoe, hike or beachcomb before boarding our boat for the return wildlife cruise to Seward. Enjoy spectacular scenery on your Alaska Railroad return trip to Anchorage.






